> The grant is in the amount \$7,500.00 to help with the façade enhancement, structural repairs front wall on  $2^{nd}$  &  $3^{rd}$  floors, new windows, floor repairs and plumbing on the  $2^{nd}$  floor of the old State Farm Insurance Building.

STANDING COMMITTEES:

Beesley remarked that you might have noticed a strong chlorine taste in your water over the past two weeks. He stated that this is a problem when we see hot weather.

The water plant used liquid chlorine to treat the water.

Hobler announced that the campgrounds at Vandalia Lake will close on October 15<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Gottman reported that the two restaurants are progressing along.

Mayor Gottman said that the walls have gone up for the two new restaurants, the Huddle House and Embers.

The theatre plans are moving along with a ground breaking to be held within the next two weeks.

Stunkel Chairman of Personnel said they may be looking for some part time help at the cemetery.

Crawford announced that the Grande Levee and Harvest Festival is set for September 27 and  $28^{\rm th}$ .

Mayor Gottman announced that Code Official Keith Meadows will be retiring in the near future.

Mayor Gottman asked the council to waive the 60 day notice that is required in his contract.

A motion was made by Beesley and seconded by Lester allowing Meadows to give the city a two week notice in the event he finds a job to where they are moving. Motion carried.

The council will be looking for a replacement in the near future.

Mayor Gottman announced that a dedication ceremony will be held on October  $12^{\rm th}$  at 10:00 A.M. for the improvements made by the members of Girl Scout Troop No. 382 at the Old State Burial Grounds.

Mayor Gottman announced that he met with the department heads asking them to work on a three year plan for capital improvements within their departments.

## **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

Mayor Gottman is asking that the list come back before the council so the city can begin the process budgeting for the improvements.

The council discussed the increase in the water and sewer rates.

Alderman Neil Clark stated believed the increases should be allowed to go into effect in October.

Alderman Hobler stated he thought they might want to look at working on a percentage of that of the 92% if we could get a 95% increase wouldn't matter. was pointed out that a number of factors, including fire department use and water leaks, also factor into bringing that percentage down. It was pointed out that a very strong effort is made on water and sewer bill collections by the staff in Clerk Bowen's office. The city has also worked to replace dead water meters to actually bill for the total amount used.
