The Governor proposed a 50 percent reduction in the local share of the income tax during his FY2016 Budget Address, reducing the City of Vandalia revenues by \$348,579.00.

Alderman Lester explained that the repairs are urgently needed to avoid voiding the warranty on the roof.

Lester said the repairs were not put out for bid due to the emergency scenario that needed taken care of.

# AUTHORIZATION TO MAGAZINE:

A motion was made by Stunkel and ADVERTISE/MARKET VANDALIA IN seconded by Crawford authorizing the TRADE & INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT City of Vandalia to Advertise/Market Vandalia in the Trade & Industry Development Magazine September/October that Vandalia has already committed to in the amount of \$2,800.00. Motion carried. Lester voted nay.

#### MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Gottman stated the City of Vandalia received a letter from the Association of Lincoln Presenters thanking the city for their hospitality in hosting the conference April 16-19<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Gottman praised LaTisha Paslay for all the hard work that she put into the event to make it a success.

There will be a Grand Opening of the "Bark Park on Saturday, May 23rd at 10:00 a.m. The City Council has been invited to attend.

Mayor Gottman reported that a new Chinese restaurant will be opening in the former GameStop location.

Mayor Gottman announced that the Fayette County Hospital is under renovation at this time.

Liberty Utilities is under construction at this time.

The Fayette County Courthouse is doing renovations on the roof at their facility.

Dates will be set for some "ribbon cuttings" in the community shortly.

The Red Door has opened their Café.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES:

Alderman Swarm reported that Second Chance Animal Rescue is requesting the city help in getting water to the new Dog Park.

Swarm said that the Vandalia Park District has agreed to pay for the water bill at the park but Second Chance is asking the city's assistance to get water lines to the dog park.

Marlin Filer who is the Public Works Director said that there is just a small line that feeds that block and it was possible to tie on to it, but eventually have to have a large line for that area of town.

Swarm said that he could see problems with that. The water not being turned off.

Mayor Gottman asked Filer to get some information on the cost of the project to get the line to the Dog Park and bring it back to the May 18th City Council Meeting.

Police Chief Jeff Ray will be attending a seminar in O'Fallon, Il on Friday, May 8th on "Police Deadly Force Events" How municipal officials should prepare and respond.

This event is being sponsored by the Illinois Municipal League and the law firm Ancel Glink.

Alderman Lester spoke with Rodney Potts in regard to the repairs at the Water Plant. They should be completed by the end of the month.

The Lake Committee will meet on Saturday, May  $9^{\text{th}}$  at 9:30 a.m. at the Vandalia Lake Marina.

Mayor Gottman has signed the ICC agreement that was approved by the city council.

Alderman Stunkel scheduled a Personnel Meeting for Monday, May  $11^{\rm th}$  at 3:00 P.M. to review the applications for the City Administrator's position.

LaTisha Paslay reported on Tourism.

The Vandalia Tourism Commission is sponsoring the annual "Abate Family Fun Fest" on Saturday, May  $16^{\rm th}$  also tying in our Armed Forces Tribute to be held also May  $16^{\rm th}$ .

The Lincoln Heritage Festival will be held on July  $11^{\text{th}}$  in the park. There will be a plant sale that day.

Alderman Stunkel asked if the Grande Levee was going to be held this year.

Paslay said that she has been told that the Grande Levee is not going to happen; it is still being discussed.

The Grande Levee is a state event and not a city one.

Alderman Lester had a concern on the appearance of Third St. and Gallatin St. and the condition of the former

Liberty Theater.

Lester said that he had spoken with Dennis Grubaugh sometime ago on more than one occasion and had not gotten any response.

Grubaugh said that he contacted the police about issues with individuals getting inside of the theater building and also pulling bricks out of the building, but hasn't gotten any response from the police on that

issue.

Grubaugh asked "how much am I supposed to put up with as a taxpayer, without police protection."

Lester was referring to the brick that were 15 to 18' high, so they were not pulled out by individuals.

Grubaugh said, "I've done a lot for the city, and I catch flack for anything, I don't take care of right away."

Lester asked Grubaugh what his definition of right away six or eight months?"

Grubaugh asked Lester if he had any idea how many buildings he had to take care of in Vandalia? How small of a crew Grubaugh has. It's himself and his nephew.

B. John Clark stated if the building was tuck pointed you wouldn't be able to pull the bricks out.

No resolution of any kind came about.

Neil Clark asked that besides a copy of the agenda for the public to review during the City Council meeting, he is asking that a complete packet be made for the audience.

Sandy Branham, representing the American Legion Auxiliary requesting a special event license.

This will allow the auxiliary to host wine tastings in conjunction with craft festivals at the American Legion.

#### AUDIENCE REQUEST:

Mayor Gottman said this was the first reading on the request. This will be a wine license only.

The city will have their legal counsel to draft an ordinance to act on at the May  $18^{\rm th}$  City Council Meeting.
