CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Gottman called the regularly scheduled meeting of the Vandalia City Council to order at 7:30 P.M.

ROLL CALL:

Aldermen present were: Rebbe, Crawford, Barker, Hubler, B. John Clark, Hobler and Stunkel. Lester was absent.

MOMENT OF SILENCE:

A moment of silence was observed for John Hubler, father of Alderman Ken Hubler. Our condolences to his family.

MINUTES:

A motion was made by Hobler and seconded by Stunkel approving the minutes from January 15, 2018. Motion carried.

REGULAR BILLS:

A motion was made by Stunkel and seconded by Barker approving the regular bills as presented. Motion carried.

SPECIAL COUNCIL BILLS:

A motion was made by Stunkel and seconded by Crawford approving the Special Bills as presented: Timmermann & Company, Inc. in the amount of \$29,500.00 for preparing the audit; PGAV, Inc. in the amount of \$9,700.00 for the comprehensive planning studies; Expansion Solutions in the amount of \$1,801.00 for

TREASURER'S REPORT:

PRESENTATION OF THE AUDIT BY TIMMERMANN & CO.

A copy of the Treasurer's Report will be filed for audit.

Dale Timmermann said that the city is in a solid financial position, noting that it had an excess of \$153,424 in its General Fund at the end of the fiscal year of April 2017.

Timmermann also mentioned that the expenses for the water and sewer systems increased by \$143,321 and \$73,948.00

He said percentage wise those are increases of 7.82% for water and 7.54% for sewer.

The council did not act on increases rates at this time.

A motion was made by Barker and seconded by Hobler approving the audit presented by Timmermann. Motion carried.
