COVID-19 DISCUSSION:

Mayor Gottman enclosed in your packets a statement from Mayor Gottman, urging citizens to continue extreme caution with COVID measures.

In our current situation, with the drastic rise in the positive cases, attending even small gatherings that mix households, or traveling to areas that are experiencing high rates of positivity, it not advised and is potentially dangerous. Mayor Gottman continues to urge those who choose to be social to please wear masks and maintain social distancing as much as possible.

Mayor Gottman reported that the City Garage employees completed their OSHA Training by the Illinois Risk Management Association.

Mayor Gottman publicly thanked all of those who were involved in the decorating for Olde Tyme Christmas.

Clerk Peggy Bowen announced that Monday, December 14th will be the first day to file for the Consolidated Election to be held on April 6, 2021.

STANDING COMMITTEES:

Barker reported that the City Crew has had several water leaks the past two weeks.

Barker mentioned that the Mayor along with the Council Members received a very nice letter from Ron & Judy Wilson on how good of a job was done on the downtown area.

Brosman wished to reiterate from the from the Water Committee that we need to add to our long-term plans dredging lagoons at the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

Brosman stated that we need to seriously plan on replacing the #1 lift station.

We need to take some action in the near future about increasing the rates that we charge the businesses that dump tank fulls of septic system clean-outs. I think we are way under market on that. Maybe, we can look at that in the near future.

Mayor Gottman said, I know there has been some concerns come up in regards police presence here in community. Mayor Gottman said that he along with Alderman Stunkel spoke with Chief Ray about this last Friday. Mayor Gottman said, I think our police officers are doing what they can to make their appearance everywhere. They can't be everyplace, every time at every minute.

The Fire Department has added back a firefighter who has left and another who has come on.

Mayor Gottman reported that the Cemetery & Water Plant received their new trucks.

Mayor Gottman wished to thank the Foundations and the people who made donations to the Cemetery.

Fire Chief, Mark Meadows has put out for bid for a water truck for the Fire Department. No other details on that at this time.

Chief of Police Jeff Ray and Mayor Gottman met with Joe Kirk in reference to the front of the Public Safety Building. Kirk said that the front of the building is deteriorating basically years of salt accumulating on the sidewalks in the winter time and rain and snow on the building. He will be making repairs to the building.

Stunkel reported that a minor repair had to be made at the loading dock at the Vandalia Lake.

Mayor Gottman reported on the company who bought L & M Antiques they have started demolition on that building. They are excited to start their renovations.

Gallatin Street Grille is getting new windows in the front.

The Kanata Blanket has submitted all their paperwork for the revolving loan.
