DISCUSSION ON UNSEWERED AREAS GRANT - ESTABLISH AREAS:

Lee Beckman from Milano and Grunloh reviewed the unsewered project area map included in the packet. The grant is a \$30,000.00 planning grant

with no leverage required. The IEPA has a 5 year grant program.

Construction and planning are both covered at 100%. If the planning grant is secured this year, then the City can apply for the construction grant. Connor asked how many users will be affected and Lee stated approximately 80 to 100 users. This will be placed on the agenda at the next council meeting for further discussion.

ENGINEERS UPDATE -JANUARY 2022:

Beckman reviewed the January 2022 Engineers update included in the packet. Once the right of ways are secured for the Safe Routes to School, the project will be ready to be bid. Regarding the water treatment plant project, the US Army Corps of Engineers requires that a wetlands delineation be completed. The engineers will be meeting with the City to discuss layout. Gottman stated approval has been received regarding improving lighting in downtown Vandalia. Discussion held regarding using an electrical board for events such as festivals in the downtown area that can be used for electrical needs.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

IML Federal Legislative agenda and IML State Legislative agenda were reviewed which were included in the packet. Lobby Day is March 23, 2022 in Springfield. Gottman has asked LaTisha for a list of grants the City has applied for and what the City's portion of the grants is that have been applied for. Once the list is compiled, Gottman will give that list to the council. All City buildings have been upgraded to LED lights.

STANDING COMMITTEES:

Barker stated a few water leaks have been repaired by the Street Department. Brosman stated no adjustment will be made on a water bill adjustment request that he received at last council meeting after he investigated the matter. Chief Ray stated that he will be holding a written examination session on Wednesday to create an eligibility list of police officers. He also stated there is a possibility of losing 2 police officers this year to retirement. Gottman stated he received letters from the FOP regarding contract negotiations.

Lester stated that he would like to continue to have a copy of the agenda placed at his seat prior to Council meetings. He expressed concern regarding traffic congestion on Veterans and Sunset and the possibility of a turning lane at that intersection. Gottman will talk to Lee from Milano and Grunloh regarding this.
