Gottman reminded the Council when specs are required, they are to be done via written specs and not verbal specs. Motion was made by Stunkel and seconded by Hobler to approve the purchase of 2 police vehicles (budgeted). Ray will write up specifications and put those out for bid. Motion carried.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Connor reported on 2 pieces of litigation. Mr. Keiser has submitted a contract for the repair of the brick on the Keiser building downtown. The Judge gave Kaiser until late August to have this completed. Connor also had Court on property located at 816 Burtschi Street. A temporary restraining order has been in place for a month, and it will continue, keeping anybody who is not there to fix that property out of it.

CITY CLERK'S REPORT:

Nothing to report.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Paslay reported on the details of Summer Fest that will be held at Vandalia Lake campgrounds on July 5 and July 6. Food trucks will be on site. A total of 5 bands are scheduled to perform on Friday and Saturday.

SAFETY CODE OFFICIAL REPORT:

Report will be in next Council packet.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Bowen asked if the City was responsible for mowing the ditches between the sidewalk and the road. Paslay stated the City mows those a few times each year. She will talk with James Jackson. Chief Rav is putting specs together for new guns for the Police Department. Stunkel reported Lake Committee met prior to the Council meeting. Plumbing for the beach house will be completed this week. 10 new buoys were ordered and have been put out in the Lake. The Danger buoys will have lights on them and they will be located near the Dam. Next year, the Committee suggested purchasing 2 new mowers, improving the second entrance/exit for permanent opening, and 2 keycoded gates. Paslay will contact Cox Surveying to schedule a survey on the second entrance/exit to define the City's property line. Suggestion was made from Lake Committee to look into putting down speed bumps on the North side. Lake lot signs will be picked up during the annual renewal period next year. Stunkel stated that volunteers are needed to serve on the Mosquito Abatement District committee. Gottman will talk to RMA. Connor reported that one subdivision leaseholder has not paid their renewal and late fees. He will send a demand letter to them on Tuesday. Economic Development Director position has been advertised with a

deadline of August 15, 2024. Motion was made by Brosman and seconded by Stunkel to approve \$450.00 to advertise in the local newspapers. Decision was made to look into radio advertising as well, and authorization was given to Gottman to approve radio advertising for the ED position.

# ANNOUNCEMENTS AND CONCERNS:

Motion was made by Lewey and seconded by Stunkel to approve a minimum of 3 more pole lights at the campground. Motion carried. Barker asked if there was any movement on the property adjacent to Stombaugh's. Gottman said he has met with one of the individuals and will make contact with them this week. Grubaugh said he was able to talk to CEFS regarding taking down the Clymer property, but is still trying to reach out to the other adjacent property owner. Gottman reported that Big River Motorsports has closed.

Motion was made by Hubler and seconded by Lewey to adjourn the meeting. Meeting was adjourned at 7:48 p.m.
