Mayor Knebel called the regularly scheduled meeting of the Vandalia City Council to order at 6:30 pm.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer's report for period ending May 30, 2025 was reviewed. Motion was made by Bowen and seconded by Brosman to file the Treasurer's report for audit. Motion carried.

ENGINEER REPORT - JUNE 2025:

Lee Beckman updated the Council on the status of ongoing and pending City projects. Construction on Randolph Street from Sunset to Shelby Avenue has begun. Work is expected to take 6 to 7 weeks. Lake Dam upgrades are completed. The vacing was done on the lead service line replacement. A third lead service line inventory grant has been applied for. Safe Routes to School construction is complete. We are waiting on a utility relocation that is being resolved. Construction on the new water treatment plant is scheduled for July. Ryan Connor is working on the right of way docket. Preconstruction meeting for the

water plant, raw water main and pressure reducing station and City Hall water main replacement will be held the second week of July. ITEP is still at IDOT. Beckman anticipates a Fall advertisement for that. Waiting on the Notice of Funding Opportunity for the Unsewered IEPA grant in late Summer. IDPH has reviewed the modified camping lot layout and Beckman said he expects approval this week. He said the City was not successful on the 319 Grant. He suggested possibly revisiting reapplying with a decision to be made at the next Council meeting. Bid opening for the 2022 DCEO Grant Application Opportunity will be held in late July or early August. This project encompasses a section along Highway 51, east to the river railroad tracks and north. Beckman stated at the last meeting he attended, the potential Randolph Street project was modified for an area that is having a lot of water issues so those plans and permits for that project will be going to the EPA in the next 2 weeks. The City of Vandalia received a Notice of State Award in the amount of \$3 million dollar for the Regional Site Readiness Grant for the Industrial Park property. The City is waiting on the grant agreement. Beckman said he hopes to have the project plans ready by next week for the sidewalk replacement project along Veterans Avenue. Barker asked if Beckman was satisfied with the cleanup from Safe Routes to School. Beckman said it could have been better. He said if there are any complaints, Council is to let Beckman know. He said there is some dirt work and concrete work that needs to be completed.

STEVE BRYANT, GOOD ENERGY
- DISCUSS HOMEFIELD
ENERGY:

Steve Bryant from Good Energy gave a presentation on Homefield Energy. He discussed the aggregate rate versus the Ameren rate. He said municipal aggregation has been in place since 2013. Bryant stated that this has saved the residents of Vandalia over \$1,000,000.00 since that time. He said the opt out letters which are mailed out every year are a regulatory requirement. He said in August/September, this will go out to bid again to see what the rates will be after December. Steve Stombaugh distributed a handout comparing Homefield and Ameren rates and any cost savings. It was his opinion that the average customer would save approximately \$131.50 if Ameren was chosen over Homefield pending rates remaining the same the rest of the year. He used the example of burning a 100 watt bulb for 30 days for 24 hours a day equals 72 KWH. The cost difference from Ameren to Homefield equals .0035 cents/KWH. The Homefield cost savings is 25 cents.

Adam Stroud from PGAV addressed the Council. He talked about the proposed targeted business district by the west interchange. He said if this agreement was approved, he would set the business district up well in advance of anything ever producing any sales tax, so there would be no loss of general fund sales tax. Stroud said business districts are approved April 1 and October 1 of every year, so if the City starts now, there is plenty of time to meet the October 1 deadline. Stroud said if the agreement is approved tonight, they will take photos of the properties and begin creating a plan. The plan will be submitted which meets the statutory

requirements of setting up a business district. The proposed timeline has final approval set for the first Council meeting of September. He sees no issue with this area qualifying.

Shane Bowen discussed his TIF application. He will be purchasing the buildings at 507, 509, 511, 513 and 515 W. Gallatin Street. He will be relocating and expanding his business to this location. He will also renovate the upstairs into 7 apartments that would be available for rent. They are asking for 25% of \$268,000.00 which amounts to \$67,000.00.

Connor stated the Ordinance presented was drafted at the request of the City's insurance provider. He stated this addresses the municipal rights of way where people consume alcohol and property owned by the City. The insurance carrier told the City that in order to trigger coverage, the City needs an Ordinance prohibiting that conduct on our premises unless it is covered by a Special Event license and coverage has been triggered that would stand between the City and the entity serving alcohol. The goal of this Ordinance is to trigger coverage in 2 ways: First, to the DRAM shop provider from the entity serving the alcohol and then second, to make sure RMA coverage is triggered because somebody has broken the law on our premises. The consumption of alcohol is prohibited on municipal rights of way except in limited instances where we have given out a permit. He stated some

of those liquor licensees who serve alcohol will have individuals end up consuming alcohol in City right of ways which is fine because a permit has been issued for that purpose. The issue occurs when people bring in outside alcohol into the right of way; that conduct is prohibited. If an accident should occur in that instance, the City will not have coverage under RMA. This Ordinance says you cannot drink alcohol in municipality rights of way. This actually goes one step further and puts it on the permit holder to prohibit that conduct. The alternative method of doing this would be for the liquor license holder to ensure anyone moving from the premises where they are serving liquor onto the right of way, that that alcohol was purchased from their establishment rather than, which the Ordinance reads, they would have to police the entire area that is a part of the permit. Either of those would be acceptable to trigger coverage but the question would be what would the City want to put on the liquor license holder. Connor said only in the event a special event permit is issued, is alcohol permitted in the municipality's right of way because we want to trigger DRAM shop coverage of the liquor license holder that is serving the alcohol. RMA has told the City unless we make that activity unlawful, the City will not have secondary coverage through our insurer. Connor said what needs to be made clear in the Ordinance is that you may not consume alcohol brought from home on a municipal right of way or consumed from a package liquor store. It must be purchased and consumed from a liquor licensee preferably on their

premises or if a permit was issued, then on premises belonging to the City of Vandalia only within the times authorized and in the manner authorized by a Special Event permit. Connor said the best practice for liquor license holders would be for them to apply for Special Event permits that would overlap. He said it is very important that the City is specific about where these various activities are allowed and where they are not.

Bowen suggested bringing the people in who will be affected by this Ordinance and have a discussion so that everybody understands why the City is doing this. Connor said the additional policy for Summer Fest last year was around \$1,100.00. Connor suggested passing this Ordinance tonight and back it off later or purchase the additional insurance policy for Summer Fest.

Workman asked how does this affect the campground. Connor said the campground is an interesting situation; it's outside of the City but it's owned by the City. Workman asked if he can take the Alcohol prohibited sign down at the campground. Connor said the sign was designed to cover a situation in which somebody would be consuming alcohol close to the water source which is something that was likely to be discouraged by the sign. Connor said the issue is triggering insurance coverage. This Ordinance is a direct response from the conversation with RMA and City officials.

Report provided in packet. Kopp reported that he would like to finish up the Clymer building demo. The dirt pile that IDOT was going to supply to fill in the hole is no longer available. Knebel asked Kopp to get quotes to buy dirt. Kopp said he would like to talk to Richard Johannes to see what his timeframe

is. He would also like to get the brickwork done. Grubaugh asked how the bar wall is going to get fixed. Kopp said he has been in contact with the bar owner regarding this. He has 3 residential structures ready for demo this year. Discussion was held regarding dilapidated properties on Edwards and Sixth Streets. Bowen said the focus needs to be on properties on main thoroughfares in the City.

Barker stated the Streets Department has been busy with picking up sticks and patching roads. Workman said problems of silting at the Lake are going to continue and suggested reapplying for the 319 Grant or a grant that would address the issue. He said he is looking for organizations to help with parking at SummerFest on June 28 from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. Organizations will be able to keep any parking donations made. Knebel reported bids were opened for the construction work on the new Telecommunications Center. Construction work will begin in the next few weeks.
